COMMUNITY CARE & COMPASSION



The food bank, located in the Sheridan Rec. Center, opened in June and will be open for distribution every Thursday evening from 4:30pm-7pm. This is an outreach project of our congregation, and we are looking for volunteers for the roles listed below. This project is not limited to our congregation - we are looking for other organizations and individuals to partner with us. Below are some immediate needs, so if you or someone you know might be interested in helping, please contact Carole Kessler (ckess911@aol.com or 720.341.7333.)

Critical Need!!

- Person(s) who are willing to drive to the Food Bank of the Rockies (FBR) warehouse (I-70 & Havana) to pick up orders ranging from 1,000-2,000 pounds and deliver them to the Sheridan Recreation Center.
 - Open bed pickups, vans, and trailers are ideal vehicles, as FBR staff can use forklifts to directly load the shrink -wrapped pallets, though we can manually load individual items into other vehicles.
 - Pickups must occur two days after an order is placed; the pickup time is assigned at the time the order is placed. We will generally try to schedule our orders to be picked up on Wednesday or Thursday. The first available pickup time is 9:00am and the last is 3:20PM. There are 5 slots

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- available every 20 minutes, so we can generally schedule a pickup according to the preference of those providing transportation.
- We would like to get enough people so that no one needs to go more than once a month.
- Person(s) or groups willing to unload FBR pickups, unpack and arrange food at the food bank. This would be a great opportunity for small groups of teens! Time is based on when pickups occur, but help is always needed on Thursdays from noon to 4:00PM.
- Spanish speakers (competent but not necessarily fluent) to help with distribution from 4-7:30PM on Thursdays.

Food and other donations continue to be needed; please check the weekly SPIN for particular needs. Note that large containers or bags of food are not helpful because we do not have health department permission to open and divide food items.
